



WHAT TO BRING FOUNDATION LEVEL CHECKLIST

What you need to return to the school office – before your child starts

Enrollment Forms (from the parent packet)

- Legal Custody Notification
- Release Authorization

Health and Immunization Records (from your pediatrician's office)

- DH 3040 Physical Exam ("School Entry Health Exam" yellow form)
- DH 680 Immunization ("Florida Certificate of Immunization" blue form)

These forms are required for each child enrolled in school by Florida State law and by the Department of Children and Families, our childcare licensing agency. Forms DH 3040 and DH 680 are issued by your pediatrician's office. Children will not be admitted to school without current forms on file.

IMMUNIZATION POLICY: Temple Beth Sholom is committed to providing a safe environment for those children who attend our school. We firmly believe that to maintain a safe environment and decrease the transmission of preventable childhood diseases all children who attend our school should receive all the recommended vaccines according to the Florida State Vaccine Requirements. The only exception to this policy is for a valid, documented medical issue/condition with supporting documentation provided by a Florida licensed physician exempting a child from doses or further doses of a specific vaccine. No other exceptions to this Policy will be accepted. Beginning in June 2013, children who have not been appropriately vaccinated will not be allowed to attend until they show proof of required immunizations.

Children who have not been appropriately vaccinated will not be allowed to attend The Innovative School of Temple Beth Sholom.

- Must be signed and returned to the school office annually as per state law.

What you should bring for the classroom

Below are the items we would like you to bring to the program on the first day. Please make sure that EVERYTHING is labeled with your child's full name.

A complete change of clothes for all ages. A gallon zip-lock bag holds it all together nicely. Please label all items with your child's name. Families who are still potty-training should bring diapers and baby-wipes to store at school.

A smock. Children are encouraged to explore the arts and some of these experiences are wonderfully messy! You may purchase a smock or bring in an oversized shirt that can be worn on top of clothes. (We encourage you to send your children to school in clothes that can be easily laundered.)

Nap-time pack. The Department of Children and Families requires a 30-minute rest period for children attending school past 12:30 pm each day. Every child who stays for the 3:00 pm dismissal must have a sheet, blanket and pillow or a sleeping bag.
